

FY2015 IT Plan Highlights

705 DMA – Department of Military Affairs

Executive Summary:

1. The Department of Military Affairs (DMA) performed an internal and external assessment of the organization, together with a critical analysis of our existing strategic plan. Identified weaknesses included impractical program divisions that impact the efficiency of the agency.
2. For fiscal year 2015, DMA is organized under one program. The agency's program managers reviewed and/or revised existing program descriptions, activities and summaries for fiscal year 2015.
3. DMA must comply with a wide range of policies and regulations regarding Information Technology (IT) systems, processes, and infrastructure.
4. National Guard Bureau (NGB) is the driving force behind many of these mandates and includes such requirements as laptop encryption and two factor authentication. DMA is working to increase compliance at our level of support, while managing the impacts on our end users through change management and communication initiatives.

Agency Vision:

Be a nationally recognized leader in urban warfare training and homeland security, able to conduct a full spectrum of missions in a joint environment.

Agency Description:

1. The New Mexico National Guard, Department of Military Affairs (NMNG/DMA) is authorized and organized in accordance with Chapter 20 NMSA 1978 to provide the necessary infrastructure to support the Army and Air National Guard, State Defense Force, Civil Air Patrol, and the NM Youth ChalleNGe Academy
2. The NMNG has 3,991 authorized military positions in the Army and Air National Guard, approximately 470 federal technicians, 413 Active Guard Reserve (AGR) federal personnel, 140 state employees, and approximately 86 members in the State Defense Force. It manages 133 buildings throughout the State, amounting to approximately 2.0 million square feet, as well as owning or managing some 26,000 acres of property, for total property values in excess of \$131 million dollars.
