

FY2015 IT Plan Highlights

218 AOC – Administrative Office of the Courts

Executive Summary:

1. The New Mexico Judiciary is positioned to continue with e-filing, e-payments and e-document initiatives state-wide. These initiatives are made possible by the completion of the statewide implementation of the Odyssey Case Management System in all magistrate and district courts during FY2013.

 - Judicial Enterprise Cyber-Security Enhancements
 - Citizen Web Portal to Consolidate all Judicial Online Services
 - Statewide Court Active Network Implementation

3. The Judicial information technology budget has been reduced dramatically over the past four years. Because of the economic downturn, court filing fees that fund the Supreme Court Automation Fund (SCAF) have dropped almost twenty percent during a period when the court technology in New Mexico has been undergoing a significant technological transformation.
4. The Supreme Court's Long Term Strategic Plan – Goals have allowed litigants to file civil court cases via the Internet without having to physically visit a courthouse. Efforts are now underway to allow case parties to settle cases and make payments of fines and fees online.

Judicial Information Division (JID) envisions providing the best information technology services to the Judiciary.

Agency Description:

The Administrative Office of the Courts exists to enable the courts of New Mexico to accomplish its mission through:

- Ensuring that the courts have adequate, equitably distributed resources
- Ensuring that the courts have and use current technology
- Providing a fair and equitable statewide human resources system
- Developing and implementing improved court processes and supporting courts in their use
- Collecting and providing information on and for the courts
- Managing and accounting for the collection of revenue
- Ensuring sound financial, budgeting and procurement practices in the management of court resources
- Providing administrative support for the magistrate courts
- Maintaining liaison with the legislative and executive branches of state government

Major IT Accomplishments of FY2013:

- Implemented e-citation data exchange between Dona Ana Sheriff and Dona Ana Magistrate Court
- Fully implemented the Odyssey Case Management System in district and magistrate courts (multi-year project)
- Statewide implementation of e-filing for attorney-filed civil cases

- XML mediated Judgment and Sentence data Exchange with Corrections

IT Strategic Goals:

Goal 1: Extend the rollout of the Odyssey Case Management Application to the Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court and the New Mexico Appellate Courts. Note: at present all state courts except for the Bernalillo County Metropolitan Court and the New Mexico Appellate courts (Supreme Court and Court of Appeals) are now fully implemented.
