

FY2015 IT Plan Highlights

264 AODA – Administrative Office of the District Attorney

Executive Summary:

1. The Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) recommended that the District Attorneys (DA's) use funds awarded through the Department of Justice from the Southwest Border Prosecution Initiative (SWBPI) to finance the Administrative Office of the District Attorneys (AODA) IT Plan for the development and implementation of a unified Case Management System (CMS).
2. The 3rd Judicial District Attorney's Office contracted with Data Ventures to redesign the current CMS into a relational database using Microsoft SQL, PHP, and Java.
3. CMS software tracks all cases to include criminal felony, criminal misdemeanor, juvenile, civil, pre-prosecution diversion clients, worthless check clients, forfeiture cases, special drug cases, and victim information. Tracking and documenting criminal cases is necessary for preparation of yearly performance base budgeting submission.

Agency Description:

AODA is responsible for providing administrative and technical support for all fourteen (14) Judicial Districts in the state through the standardization and coordination of staff development, human resource a fiscal guidance, central victim notification, development and implementation of an automated case management and tracking system, and by acting as the central communication link with other criminal justice agencies.
